3. Report in regard to the health of the prisoner. Please forward a certificate of the prison physician showing the exact state of the health of the convict, but do not incur expense therefor without express authority of the Attorney General.

4. If you have information that the prisoner is subject to rearrest or deportation upon release, please so advise.
