Regarding Morello, No 2882, I beg to report to you that this man weighed 154 lbs upon his arrival here and now weighs 185 lbs, a considerable gain.

Morello has suffered a great deal from pains in the region of the heart, which apparently were caused by poor circulation, and on that account he was put on heart tonics and heart stimulants with very beneficial results.

He seems to have been getting along nicely of late and shows considerable improvement over his condition a year ago. He continues to occasionally require a course of heart stimulants, but in spite of this, from the condition of pulse at the present, and an examination of his heart, combined with this substantial gain in weight, I should say that his general condition is very good.
