Sir:-

Acknowledging receipt of your telegram
of yesterday reading as follows:

"January 1, 1918, President commuted sentence
Guiseppe Morello to fifteen years. This commutation
wiped out fine. Morello should be released upon ex-
piration fifteen years with commutation, if earned,
deducted."

I beg to advise you that the order commuting
the sentence of Guiseppe Morello to fifteen years spe-
cifically dispenses with the \$1000.00 fine which was
attached to the original sentence. The fifteen year
sentence in this case, will expire, minus all allowance
for good conduct, March 18, 1920, when this prisoner
will be released, unless he should hereafter forfeit
any of his good time commutation allowances.
