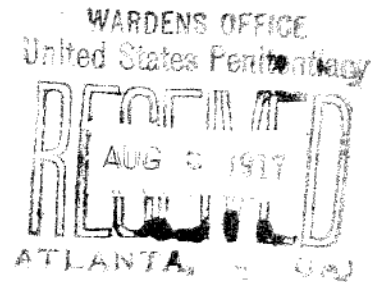
The conduct of Mr. Morello during his confinement at this institution has been uniformly good.


Sir:

Regarding your request for a report on the physical condition of Guiseppe Morello, Register No. 2882, I beg to advise you that since my last report of July 22, 1915, he has developed a definite organic heart lesion, which requires constant care and treatment, and has lost some weight.

Though with the treatment, he has been enabled to continue at work. This trouble will naturally grow worse. In justice to him, I will say that he has always been willing to attend to his duties, despite his physical affliction.

With his present physical condition and his age, I cannot help but think, that at any time, he is likely to break very rapidly in health.
