Dear Giuseppe

This letter to give you my hearty thought to follow you ever in Prison - the wishes of my soul; to tell you that: I never'll forget you; and I'm feeling sorry while you are in Prison. I'm thinking of you more and more every day, and I always think you suffer, you're all your sorrow - Oh! yes the cell: many thoughts, many dreadful imaginations, many memories from the past. I guess everything is passing in your mind - But, my dear, you never appreciate the love toward you as well as when you are in pain; and never the friendship is more powerful than the time when you are in misfortune.

My dear, I suffered also and if by luck I never been in Prison, God spare me from it, nevertheless my troubles been great, and by experience and so I know that: The misfortune does not make you forgetful and generous, but increases in you soul the love it be is there, if it is not there yet the trouble make him born. The pain is the ring with connects the men - My mind is with you always and I'm thinking how you are alone how you shall think, you're all and I'm thinking of your children of your land. And every thing make me feel what you are thinking and my

soul fly to you -

I'll go ~~on~~ further on. What now I write to you about my wishes; some time I take the pen to write, but right way to put it down because I do not know how to beginning the letter; I have nothing to tell you and no talk to make with you - I'm doing always the same old thing - Pappa and mama everyday with same wishes and the same hopes, for the day after; but the day after is like to day - We are waiting you good news and it never come - Lina also does not write so often and even she says: I do not write to her -

There is something extraordinary. I'm really able to write but when I get to do it, my letter is so unlucky to not reach the address and so I never get any reply. I do not blame you, because you can not do it; but your wife write every three moons. I stop this talk to go to the end. I wish for you better luck and better future. Pappa and mamma and you the Holy blessing, Cicina and you her best regards. When you'll write to Lina and all, send to them my best regards.
